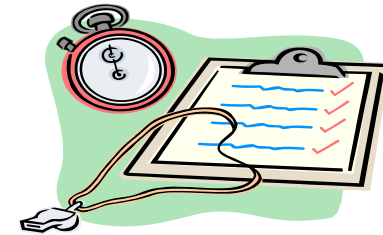

School Philosophy . . . To provide officials who wish to advance to the next level and, men and/or women who desire to become officials, with the necessary tools to grow and enhance their officiating skill and knowledge.

The philosophy of officiating, pre-game conferences, game management (e.g. handling of coaches, players), signals, and many other officiating topics are discussed in detail. Officiating techniques are demonstrated by veteran officials. Classroom discussions, demonstrations, films and video viewing of on-court officiating are also used as teaching tools. A strong emphasis is placed on individualized instruction, team officiating, and mechanics.

Break-out sessions are used to discuss areas that are commonly misunderstood. The staff will work with you individually to provide team and leadership skills. The staff will also provide you with verbal and written critiques.

We generally have various collegiate supervisors attend the School as guest speakers and also to observe officials. Many of our past school participants have been selected to work higher level basketball after being observed by various collegiate supervisors.

We invite you to participate and enjoy what many of our participants have described as a stepping stone experience in their basketball officiating career.

Staff . . . The staff is comprised of a number of outstanding veteran men and women basketball officials who work different conferences. The blend of skill, knowledge, experience and leadership provides a solid foundation for anyone who commits to take the job of officiating seriously.

The staff director, Willie L.A. Jones, has been an official for more than twenty-five years. Mr. Jones coordinates the court assignments for staff and school participants.

Staff members men and women officials and observers who work in the NBA, ACC, Atlantic 10, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, CAA, CIAA, Conference USA, ECAC, MAAC, Northeast, and Big South conferences.

Director ... Donnee Gray officiates in several Division I and II conferences. His collegiate accomplishments include officiating in the NCAA Men's Division I Tournament from 1989-2007. Donnee was selected to officiate the NCAA Final Four tournament in 1998, 2000, 2003 and 2004. Other post-season accomplishments include working the Atlantic 10, Big East, Big Ten (championship game 2004-2007), and Horizon conference tournaments. Donnee was also selected to work the NIT Semi-Final (1997; 2003) and the NIT Championship (1996). He has officiated several international basketball tournaments -- Portugal (1999), Australia (1997), France (1994), South America (1990), and Japan (1990).

Donnee is the Past President of the Big Ten Basketball Officials Association and has also served as the President of the CIAA Basketball Officials Association since 1997. Donnee is the Past President for the Northern Board of Basketball Officials (1993-98; 2001-04) and Past President of IAABO Board #134 (serving three terms).

Donnee was featured in the *Wall Street Journal*, March 8, 2005 edition; March 2000 issue of *Referee Magazine*; *The Congressional Record*, Vol. 144, March 31, 1998, No. 39, Tribute to Donnee Gray; *Roll Call*, April 6, 1998, Senate Librarian Does Double Duty as NCAA Ref; *The Washington Post*, Sports Section, Calls to Glory

(March 19, 1997); and, in the February 1997 issue of *Ebony Magazine*. In 1998, Donnee was inducted into St. Mary's College of Maryland Hall of Fame as "1998 Hall of Fame Legend." In 2007 Donnee was also inducted into the College of Southern Maryland Hall of Fame.

Donnee is currently the Supervisor of Officials for the Mid-Atlantic College Basketball Officials Association (MACBOA). He assigns officials for all of the Junior Colleges in the State of Maryland and several independent Division I schools. In 2007 Donnee was inducted into the JUCO Hall of Fame.

Guest Lecturers... As in years past, we expect to have several men's and women's Supervisors and Coordinators of Officials from different collegiate conferences attend this camp. Included among those are Art Hyland, (Big East Conference); Brenda Gelston (Colonial Athletic Association); Jim Burch (Southern Conference) and the Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association (CIAA)); Edgar Cottoto (Northeast Conference); Luis Grill (Mid-Eastern Atlantic Conference); Owen Hannah (PSAC); and Brad Tracy (MAAC). Many camp participants have been selected by these individuals to officiate basketball in their conferences.
